Lori Lipptz

Lori founded the JKO in 1994 with Roz Ebstein z"l, under the sponsorship of the Board of Jewish Education. In 1996, the JKO became an independent entity, and Lori has been managing the JKO since then, as well as running rehearsals and coaching JKO vocalists. In her other hat, she is the founder and Artistic Director of the Maxwell Street Klezmer Band, as well

as the Founder and Executive Director of the not-for-profit organization, the Klezmer Music Foundation.



Alex Koffman

Alex received his Master's Degree from the Conservatory of Minsk in Belarus, and conducted a military orchestra in the Red Army. Trained in both performance and pedagogy, Alex has been leading the JKO for the past two decades with heart and a Yiddishe neshome (Jewish soul).

In Memoriam



Sam Margolis

Sam was the trombonist of the Maxwell Street Klezmer Band in the 1990s, and JKO's First Conductor. With a gentle manner, a quirky sense of humor, and love of kids, Sam taught and nurtured the first wave of JKO musicians.



Ralph Wilder

Ralph was a clarinetist with Maxwell Street Klezmer Band since 1989, and JKO's second conductor, in the 2000s.

Ralph was adept in many styles including orchestral, ballet, Broadway musicals, rock, pop, jazz, Dixieland, New Age, and, of course, Klezmer. With the highest standards and musicianship, Ralph demanded and brought out the best in his students.

About Special Guest Ian Weinberger (JKO Class of 2005)



Ian Weinberger is the music director of *Hamilton* on Broadway. He is a proud member of the hip-hop improv group Freestyle Love Supreme, with whom he performed on Broadway and Off-Broadway, at the Kennedy Center, and on the Tony Awards. New York credits include *Chess*, *A New Brain*, *Titanic* (Lincoln Center), *Nobody Loves You*, and the premiere presentation of *The Eyes of the World: From D-Day to VE Day* at Carnegie Hall. Other new works include *The Secret of My Success* (Paramount Theatre) and *Titanic* (Hangar Theatre).

His arrangements and orchestrations of *Titanic* and Disney's *Moana Jr.* have been heard in productions around the world. Other Broadway and Off-Broadway orchestras he has conducted and/or served as keyboardist include *The Book of Mormon*, *Kinky Boots*, *Rocky the Musical*, *Side Show*, *Chaplin*, and *Little Miss Sunshine*. Television credits include *Fosse/Verdon*, *Peter Pan Live!*, and *The Sound of Music Live!*. Cast recordings include *The Christmas Schooner*, *A New Brain*, and *The Theory of Relativity*. He holds a bachelor's degree in music education and percussion performance from Northwestern University and a master's degree in jazz piano from New York University.

Ian writes: "I entered the Junior Klezmer Orchestra as a drummer sometime around age eleven. It was my first experience playing in an organized band or musical ensemble of any kind! I remember how welcoming Lori and all of the musicians were, and how quickly I felt like "one of the family." I had so much fun getting to know klezmer as a genre and improving as a klezmer musician.

But, the surprising bonus was that klezmer offered me a new way to experience Judaism and my connection to the Jewish community. Suddenly, I found that my enthusiasm for and appreciation of the music became a large part of my identity as a young Jewish person. Lori and her colleagues know so much about klezmer music, and they care so deeply about it – and their willingness to share the knowledge and the joy of playing klezmer is a true gift to a young musician like I was. Their excitement was, and is, infectious.

I also loved being a member of JKO because the music was FUN! It was such a blast to get to experience playing in a band with other young people my age from around Chicagoland. That experience only deepened my love for playing music and made me more eager to pursue playing in ensembles as I moved through high school, and eventually as I entered college as a music student. Today, I'm proud to be the music director and conductor of *Hamilton* on Broadway. It's a dream job, and I know my love for being in a band – collaborating on making music together – started in the JKO."
